

Reddit Keyword Opportunity Analysis

Keywords: SMTP Server | SMTP Relay | Service SMTP

Prepared for turboSMTP | February 2026

Based on 492 unique Reddit threads across 60+ subreddits

1. Executive Summary

We analyzed 492 unique Reddit threads containing the keywords "SMTP server," "SMTP relay," and "service SMTP." These threads represent real people actively searching for, struggling with, or discussing exactly the type of service turboSMTP offers. The data reveals massive demand for SMTP relay services, concentrated in IT professional and self-hosting communities, driven primarily by three forces: Microsoft's SMTP Basic Auth deprecation, the complexity of configuring SMTP for devices like scanners, and the difficulty of self-hosting email. turboSMTP is mentioned in zero of these 492 threads.

Key finding: "SMTP relay" threads have the highest average engagement (17.5 comments) and are overwhelmingly concentrated in r/sysadmin (63 threads). These are IT professionals actively seeking solutions. "SMTP server" threads skew toward end-user configuration help (Thunderbird, Gmail). "Service SMTP" threads have the highest per-thread engagement (21.2 avg comments), often being complex enterprise discussions.

2. What People Are Talking About

We classified every thread by its primary intent. A single thread can have multiple intents.

3. Problems People Face

These are the specific technical and business problems being discussed across all 492 threads.

4. Brands People Mention

When people discuss SMTP services on Reddit, these are the brands that come up. This represents the competitive mindshare landscape.

6. Highest-Opportunity Thread Categories

6.1 Microsoft SMTP Auth Deprecation (The Big Wave)

Microsoft is deprecating Basic SMTP Authentication in 2026. This is generating massive Reddit activity and confusion. The thread "With smtp auth going away in 2026, how do you plan on..." has 200+ comments in [r/sysadmin](#) alone. Multiple threads in [r/Office365](#), [r/exchangeserver](#), and [r/msp](#) discuss what to do when basic SMTP auth stops working for scanners, printers, and legacy applications.

This is the single largest opportunity in the data. Organizations with scanners, ERP systems, and legacy applications that currently authenticate directly to O365 SMTP will need a third-party SMTP relay service. turboSMTP is a direct answer to this problem.

6.2 Scanner/Printer Device Relay (High-Urgency Niche)

37 threads specifically discuss SMTP relay for scanners, printers, and multifunction devices. The engagement is extremely high: "SMTP relay suggestions for legacy SMTP devices" has 110+ comments in [r/msp](#), "What is everyone doing for Scan to Email?" has 110+ comments, and "365 shops how are you handling SMTP relay" has 250+ comments.

These threads are characterized by urgency. IT admins and MSPs need a working solution for client devices that can only do basic SMTP. They are actively asking for service recommendations and are willing to pay for reliability.

6.3 Recommendation Threads (Direct Conversion)

70 threads are people directly asking for SMTP service recommendations. Key examples:

"What SMTP providers do you recommend" (70+ comments, r/nextjs), "SMTP relay suggestions" (60+ comments, r/sysadmin), "Best free SMTP solution to use with self-hosted" (90+ comments, r/selfhosted), "SMTP mail relay - recommended providers?" (60+ comments, r/msp), "On Prem SMTP Relay suggestions" (60+ comments, r/sysadmin).

In every single one of these threads, people recommend SendGrid, Mailgun, SES, SMTP2GO, and Brevo. turboSMTP is never mentioned. These are the threads where a single helpful comment could drive direct signups.

6.4 Self-Hosters Seeking Relay (Free Tier Funnel)

49 threads in r/selfhosted and 8 in r/homelab discuss outbound email for self-hosted applications. Many specifically ask for free or low-cost SMTP relay services. Threads like "How do you send mail from your services?" (130+ comments), "Best free smtp service" (70+ comments), and "How do I host an SMTP relay for free?" (40+ comments) show strong demand.

This audience tends to start with free tiers and upgrade as projects grow. turboSMTP's 6,000 free emails/month is competitive here but has zero visibility.

6.5 Google Workspace SMTP Changes (Emerging)

20 threads discuss Google Workspace tightening or changing SMTP relay access. "SMTP relay alternative now that Google workspace no longer..." (50+ comments, r/homelab) is representative. Users who relied on Google for relay are being forced to find alternatives. This is a smaller but growing opportunity.

7. Recommendations for turboSMTP

7.1 Immediate Actions (Based on Current Reddit Activity)

1. Engage in SMTP relay recommendation threads on r/sysadmin

r/sysadmin has 88 threads, 19 of which are people directly asking for SMTP relay suggestions. These threads have 60-250+ comments. A genuine, helpful presence here (not spam) answering questions about SMTP configuration and mentioning turboSMTP where relevant would put the brand in front of its highest-value audience.

2. Create content around Microsoft SMTP Auth deprecation

The "SMTP auth going away in 2026" thread has 200+ comments and there are 15+ related threads. turboSMTP should publish a guide specifically addressing "How to set up SMTP relay for Office 365 after Basic Auth deprecation" and share it in relevant threads. This positions turboSMTP as the solution to a problem affecting thousands of organizations.

3. Target scanner/printer relay use case on r/msp

37 device relay threads with extremely high engagement (110-590+ comments). MSPs manage hundreds of clients with scanners. A single MSP converting to turboSMTP can represent bulk accounts. Create a dedicated "Scan to Email relay setup" guide and engage in r/msp threads.

4. Claim visibility in r/selfhosted with the free tier

49 threads in r/selfhosted, many seeking free SMTP relay. turboSMTP's 6,000 free emails/month is directly competitive. When people ask "what free SMTP service do you use for your homelab," turboSMTP should be in the answers. Currently it is not mentioned once.

7.2 Content/SEO Opportunities (Based on Problem Data)

The problem data reveals content gaps turboSMTP can fill:

8. Bottom Line

The Reddit data tells a clear story: there are 492 threads of people actively discussing, searching for, and struggling with the exact service turboSMTP sells, and turboSMTP appears in none of them. The demand exists. The frustration with competitors is real. The migration pressures from Microsoft and Google are creating new buyer urgency. The gap is purely one of visibility and community presence.

Three numbers that matter:

492 threads discussing SMTP services on Reddit, 70 threads directly asking for provider recommendations, and 0 mentions of turboSMTP. Closing this gap is the opportunity.
